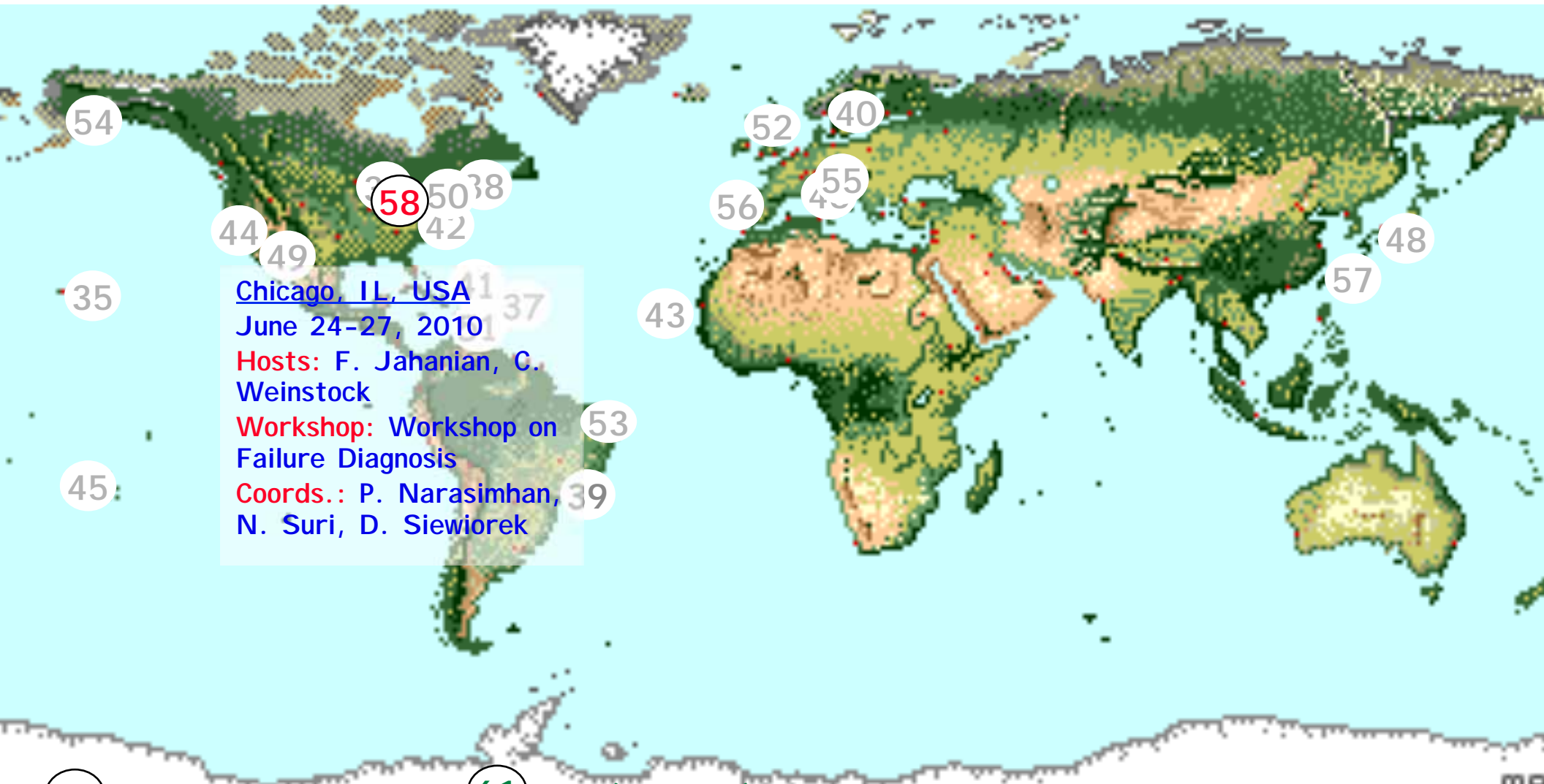

Dependability, Security, and Safety Issues for the Smart Part of a Smarter Planet

Technical Synopsis:

The application of vast distributed computing structures is enabling better management of societies infrastructure so that better results can be achieved with less investment in the base infrastructure. In some places it has gone to the point that the infrastructure is optimized to the point that it the “smarts” are required to operate.

While much of the focus has been on the algorithmic nature of the smarts, i.e., what is it doing and how is it achieving the better results, less (*or no*) attention is being focused on the critical dependency on the “smarts” that is being created.

For example: Loss of traffic optimization functions for a smart city could lead to complete gridlock; loss of the smarts in a smart electric grid could easily lead to a wide area cascade failure.

Workgroup will focus on the availability, accuracy, security, privacy, safety and policy issues raised by this growing dependency.

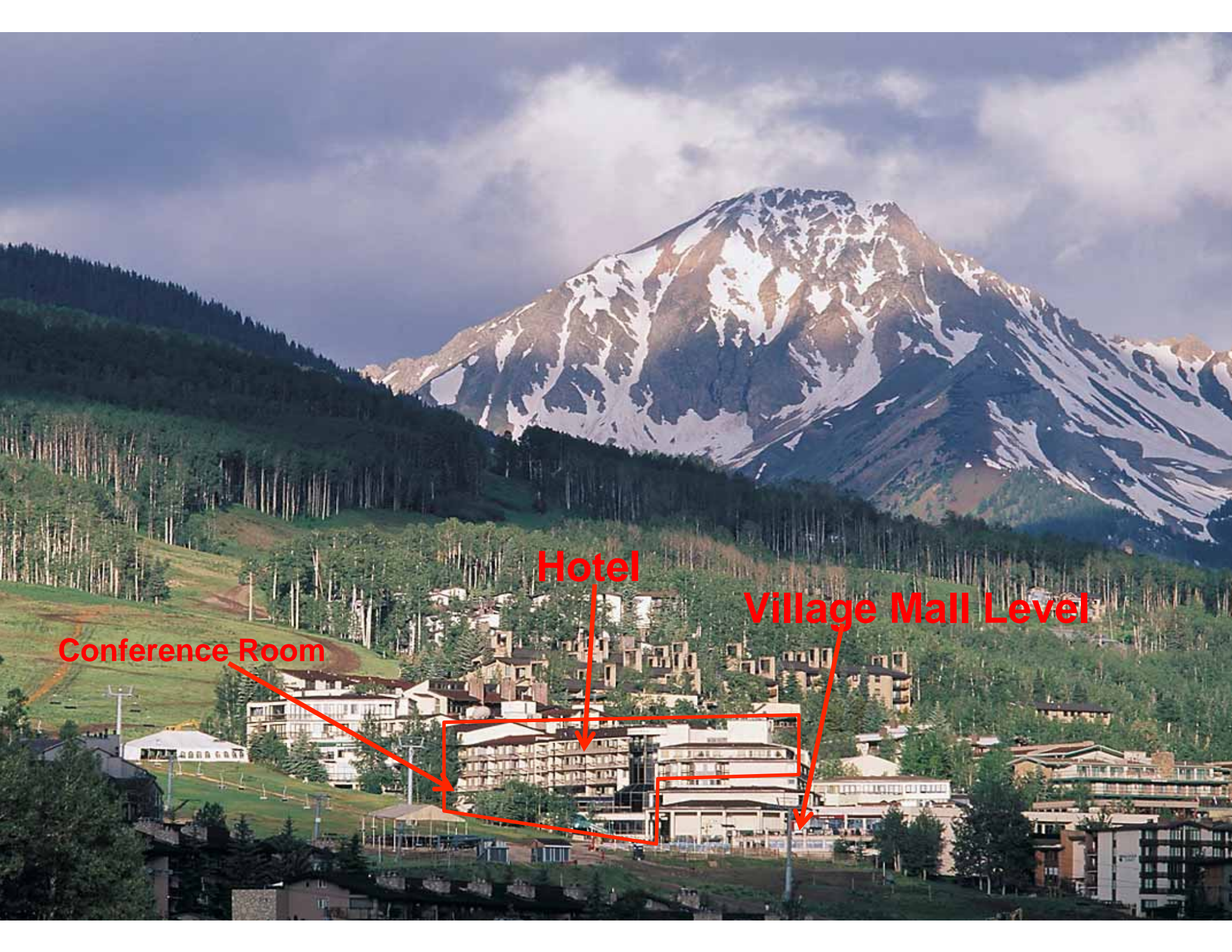
- Other airports: Eagle, CO ~50 min away (\$76 shuttle service to Aspen/Snowmass)

**Aspen area has extensive free public transport (and little parking)
 (Parking at hotel is \$28 / week)**

Additional Venue Detail :

- Silvertree is directly above Snowmass Village Mall - Hotel has entrance directly to mall
 - Many restaurants to many tastes and budgets just steps away.
 - Of course the normal collection of ski shops/ski rental places
 - Shops for essentials (i.e., furs, jewelry)
 - Shuttles to Aspen proper leave regularly from mall (last bus back at 2 am)
 - Hotel has 30% discount with ski rental shop directly below hotel in mall
- Snowmass Village itself is on main ski trail coming down from mountain.
 - Village follows and is aligned along descent of trail
 - For Silvertree Hotel which is directly on this trail this means:
 - Conf room on floor four is at ground level (12 steps to skis on/off)
 - Lobby on first floor is also at ground level
 - Mall entrance is two stories below lobby and is at ground level
 - Main lift load point is about 200 m vertical below hotel, unload 700 m above
- Downtown Aspen is 15 to 20 min by shuttle from Snowmass Village
 - Staggering collection of restaurants, art galleries, shops, and vintage silver rush architecture.
- Both Silvertree and Wildwood have heated outdoor pools & spas (hot tubs), Silvertree provides spa services, has health club, and concierge services.

Additional Venue Detail :

- Conference Room has windows and overlooks main Snowmass ski trail into village
- Conference Room also has outside deck directly overlooking trail
(smoking is permitted on this deck just outside room, *not that I would recommend it*)
- It is 12 flat steps from conference room door to where you would put on ski's and ski away, or take off ski in and take off skis and walk into room.

It would be easy to meet family for skiing during break, without inconveniencing them too much

- Aspen area is home of 4 ski mountains <http://www.aspensnowmass.com/>
 - Aspen Mountain (the one you see in pictures above Aspen proper – see below)
 - Aspen Highlands (noted for Highland Bowl experience)
 - Buttermilk Mountain (believe X games will be underway there during our visit)
 - Snowmass Mountain (6% easiest, 50% more difficult, 12% most difficult, 32% expert)
- Snowmass Mountain is one of the largest ski areas in North America, it is several times larger than other three Aspen mountains combined.
 - I will lead tour of my favorite expert terrain if any are interested on activity day.
(for those interested in tree skiing this could be a treat! – see below)
 - Less aggressive tours (or more aggressive) for those who need company
 - Snowmass has virtually no lift lines ever!
- Lots of other activities beyond skiing
